Anniversary


Still learning and evolving as a parish church

LAMPS Collective, a group from Oxford, offer their passion play in Holy Week. They are on a tour of Scotland and we have been able to host them for two shows, an afternoon and an evening one. This is a deeply moving play with music and words on the passion. It is open to everyone in our community and beyond. Please do invite others and bring yourself.

We have talent everywhere and so we bring it all together in a great concert of words and music and everything in between. Oor ain folk from across the generations and community.

APRII

Anniversary Concert Friday 19th

7.30pm

When John Knox taught the first of the reformed how to share communion, he did so in Finlaystone Estate on the banks of the Clyde. In memory they planted a Yew tree on the very spot the first communion service was shared in Scotland. We still share that same basic liturgy in our communion. In commemoration we will plant our own Yew tree and share communion, looking towards the next 375 years.

SEPTEMBER

Dedication Service Sunday 1st

Beginning a new season with a belonging service that includes and dedicates us all. There is a space for everyone. Come and remind ourselves whose we are and the parish we serve.

Schools Stained Glass Mid September

Having told the story of the parish to all our primary schools, our windows tell it back to us in stained glass. We're creating an exhibition that will cover all the windows in the hall, imagined by the young folk in our community.

Open Doors Mid September

The church is open to explore and retell the parish story in glass, image, and conversation. Organised by the Heritage Forum.

The big finale where we stretch right up to the top of our parish and include the farmland and agricultural heritage. A unique harvest service to celebrate the bounty of the parish and give thanks for 375 years of a parish whose land has given of itself. A time to rededicate ourselves to caring for it in a time of climate change.

AND BEYOND

Over the next few years we seek to work with others to explore and reestablish the pathways of faith that brought the monks from Paisley Abbey to the northside of the river and laid the foundations of Kilpatrick with a church on this site in the 13C. The idea is to recreate a pilgrims' way, a path that leads from Paisley to New Kilpatrick and over to Old Kilpatrick and, in due course, walk it together, meeting folk along the way from all walks of life: a faith route into the future.
