
#### Lockdown Logo

We're updating the windows of the New Halls to keep the message alive. It's week ten and, for some, it has been a long time. Others have been able to fill their time easily. We want to bring together the story that lockdown has not been the same for everyone, and we'd like to update our logo to reflect that.

Telling our lockdown stories

Our logo is a cross of five different coloured squares, reflecting our intent for diversity and our trust in God's promise, found in the rainbow. We've done that using a montage of the church windows to create the colours.

But we'd like to grow that and invite everyone, beyond the congregation too, to send in photos of their lockdown experiences, the walks they have been on, the activities they have done, in the same colours as the cross (green, blue, red, yellow/orange and purple) that we can bring together and let our logo tell the story of lockdown.



Here's an example of a version using plants and, given so many have been gardening, that's one story of lockdown. But other stories include masks, empty streets, baking, mood colours, some of the things that others have done to help us; each image being mainly one of the colours of the rainbow, which we'll turn into a variety of crosses.

To finish our garden must have thyme: thyme for rest, thyme for fun, thyme for ourselves.


