#### **Christmas Services**

Sunday 19th December is Nativity Sunday, and we offer two celebrations that day. In the morning and online, we present a unique puppet nativity written by and designed by the Sunday School. That will form the main part of the service in the morning.

In the afternoon, we have our carol service, led by the choir, at 4.30pm in the sanctuary: a blend of carols and readings for the season.

Christmas Eve, between 6.30 and 7.30pm, depending if we consider it safe to do so, we have our light festival, outdoors regardless of the weather! Wear something warm and waterproof. We have a maximum of 300 people, and everyone will receive a light bag when they arrive. This will be your ticket. We ask you to wear masks and remain socially distanced throughout. As with everything at the moment, we will take as few risks as possible, weighing up the severity of Omicron, and may cancel at the last moment.

At 11.30pm on Christmas Eve, we have our Watchnight Service in the church, with all the usual mitigations in place.

There is no Christmas Day service, but we are back again on Boxing day at the usual time of 10.30am in the sanctuary.

There will be a short video service suitable for Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
