entecost has often been described as the birthday of the church. Maybe, but the real symbolism of the festival is community: creating community in all its diversity. It is what happened in the story of Pentecost in Acts, and it is what we are continually attempting to do as a faith community.

Sanctuary: Church

What's in a name?

number of people have asked recently why we have called worship in the church building 'sanctuary' worship.

It grew out of lockdown when we didn't want to suggest online worship wasn't 'church'. Indeed, church is who we are as a community, rather than the building we worship in, and traditionally the space has always been called a sanctuary.

When worship was able to return to a physical space, we then called that 'sanctuary' worship simply to differentiate it from online worship, or phoneline worship, all equally as valuable and important for people, depending on their circumstances.

But, more than that, we might discover again the bigger idea of sanctuary as a safe place, a place for those who feel fragile, who are lost, who are homeless in the world, whose lives are in danger. As a church, we are called to offer sanctuary, a safe space.

Might this be one of the principles and values we explore again as we grow out of the pandemic and reinterpret who we are, and who we need to be in the world today?

Covid: Sanctuary Numbers

s we move down the protection levels in our area, and hopefully we will continue to do so, we are still cautious and are doing everything to limit any possible spread of coronavirus.

We have moved, now, to level 2, which means, for us, numbers in the sanctuary can rise to 75, which is our maximum number from now on until social distancing is relaxed. We continue to use a booking system. It is quite simple: please phone the church office (0141 942 8827), and leave your name and number, and the secretary will phone you back on the Friday to confirm a place. Please book by the Thursday evening before the Sunday you wish to attend.

We still need to wear masks, and general congregational singing is not allowed yet, but we try to create a worshipful space that is peaceful, thoughtful and imaginative, using a screen to show hymn words (which we quietly hum to) and other visuals.
