We are already thinking ahead to Harvest on 5th October, that traditional festival which seems a bit surreal in these times. Covid has changed us in many ways but the harvest has become all the more important. Yet, our harvest this year is to be quite different from the days when "All is safely gathered in" meant something real.

So we have developed a festival that speaks into our context, yet still recognises the old tradition.

Broadcast

The traditional term for sowing seeds was called broadcasting, the farmer in the field, casting great handfuls of seed across the land: broadcasting.

Today we use the term ubiquitously to mean social media, TV and other ways of sharing stories and news. In an age of YouTube and podcasts and Zoom that is where we'll find ourselves this year: broadcasting.

A Harvest of...

Well, we've had a think about what our harvest is this year which is different than years gone by. We can talk of crops and autumn colours etc, but because of the peculiar context of pandemics we've gathered in a harvest of family time for many, neighbourhoods coming together, at least initially, the need to find a new balance in life amongst a rise in mental ill health, caring for neighbour which was what marked the first weeks and months of lockdown

Harvest Gifts

And so we will gather gifts. Traditionally we have brought gifts to the church on Harvest Sunday as well as donated towards Christian

Aid. The Christian Aid appeal has already been mentioned and our collection of gifts will be a more creative way of responding to local food banks.

We invite everyone to consider what gift you would like to give, offering a selection: a food pack, a children's bundle, a toiletry box, a breakfast bag. Each will cost a different amount and people will be able to go to the church website and choose the they want to send order through the church website, and we will send what they have chosen to a variety of organisations. It is a bit like Oxfam's "Buy a Goat" initiative. We're setting that up now and should be ready in the next few days.

Some may wish to donate specific things to the local food bank. We will have a list next week. In that case the church halls will be open once a week to receive items which we will take to the organisations directly.

Harvest Blessing

But we also wish to offer blessings to the whole community, turn ourselves outwards again, share what we have with our neighbours.


At the back of this bulletin you'll find the outline of an apple. We'd like you to colour in, paint it, embroider, crochet, cut out of wood, or whatever creative way you'd like, to recreate that apple and write on it a blessing, a word of hope, a prayer for the community or world. Take a photo of it with your phone and email it, or physically post it to us. We'll print them out and add them to our harvest tree which will be created on the church hall window, so as the community passes they can read the blessings, the prayers, the hopes.

A month long

Instead of a day, we're making Harvest a month, all the way through October, each week a different theme. Week One: tins; Week Two: toiletries etc. Each weekend these items can be dropped off at the New Halls.

Harvest Festival

O, and worship, of course! We've designed a Harvest Festival on Zoom at the same time as the Sanctuary service. We have the technology to connect us all so we'll have our festival on Zoom at 10.30 and link in with the sanctuary service. We'll all be face to face, or mask to face and it is going to be amazing!
