Gavin's Mill Bake Off

To celebrate Fairtrade Fortnight, Gavin's Mill invite you to join them in a Fairtrade Bake Off on Sunday 6 March.

The competition and tasting will take place at Gavin's Mill and there are three categories:

Category A for children at primary schools:

Please bake a batch (at least four all the same) of your favourite biscuits, using at least two Fairtrade ingredients or more if you can.

Category B for pupils at secondary schools:

Please bake a batch (at least four all the same) of your favourite cupcakes, using at least two Fairtrade ingredients or more if you can.

Category C for everyone else:

Please bake a cake (just one!) suitable for morning coffee or afternoon tea, using at least two Fairtrade ingredients or more if you can.

The event will be open for bakers to submit their Bake-Off entries from 1pm to 2pm. Judging will start at 2pm.
