You can run up a square while watching one episode of Eastenders, or, if you would like company knitting, come and join our "knitting/sewing bees" in the NK hall: the next one is on **Tuesday 15 March, from 10am – 12noon**. For some that may still be edging out of lockdown, this might be an opportunity to go to a small group, distanced at long tables, either knitting or sewing, whichever you prefer, have a bit of chat and a carefully provided cup of tea or coffee with even an individually-wrapped biscuit or piece of baking. Wool and sanitation can be provided.


