You may have read the Moderator's comment on the front page of the Church of Scotland website this week but if you haven't, here they are:

The Moderator said it was "wonderful" to see such a wide cross-section of community representatives and ecumenical and interfaith partners at the event. "The sanctuary was full, and the breakfast was heaving, people were queuing out of the door at 9am," she added.

"A lot of thought had gone into the service; children were involved, and it was not just a celebration for the congregation but of the part they play in the community. There was a real sense of community purpose in that place, and I came away buzzing, it was superb. I found a congregation not only in good heart but intentionally looking for imaginative ways to be part of the community - to bring people into the space and work outside it."

What the Moderator describes is our intent and promise towards our parish of which this last weekend was only the latest point where we recognised who and whose we are.

Thank you for that hospitality, imagination, enthusiasm, and love that are all the essential ingredients, as well as intuitive gifts, of a congregation full of life and creativity.

St Gregory's Food Bank

There will be a good opportunity during the Service this Sunday to hear more about one of our Community projects.

St. Gregory's co-ordinator, **Eileen Low**, is coming along to speak to us. There will also be a chance during coffee time in the Hall to ask her any questions you may have. The Foodbank is situated next to the Wyndford flats, a particularly deprived area of Maryhill, and it has been shown that the cost-of-living crisis is disproportionately hitting the most vulnerable in our society.

Basic non-perishable, nutritious foods are needed - e.g. tinned meat, fish, soups, baked beans and fruit. Also, tea, coffee, sugar, and long-life milk as well as pasta and rice are required. Baby essentials including wipes and nappies (size 3 and above), toothpaste and shampoo are most welcome. Financial contributions, of course, are always very acceptable. Housebound? If you are interested, or know of anyone who is, please let us know. The classes will begin in March and there is no pressure to ultimately join.


