Royal pageants and coronations don't come round that often, so we're making a point of celebrating our community with some fun and imagination over this coronation weekend.

On Sunday, we offer an invitation to be part of a number of things.

At the service we have the **1st Bearsden Boys' Brigade** parading for their 125th anniversary.

We also invite you to **dress up** a bit if you wish, wear a hat, and think back about how we used to get all dressed up to go to church. We're making it like Royal Ascot but there is absolutely no pressure to do this. It's just fun.

Immediately following worship this Sunday, we have a **coronation celebration** in the manse garden. **Bring your own picnic** and any garden seat you wish.

We're also holding a coronation **cake competition**. Coronation chicken was invented for the last coronation. This time round we're suggesting a coronation cake, designed, created, and produced by yourselves, if you feel able. Bring your cakes along to the picnic where we will simply show our appreciation by sharing them with each other. If it rains, we'll take everything into the hall, so we'll still enjoy ourselves together.

It is all free, so please do come along. You can drop off your seat in the garden before the service or on Saturday. It is going to be great, with a special prize for all those who bake a cake.

Monetary donations are also extremely welcome. The Halls are open Mon. to Fri. (9.00 a.m. to 2.30 p.m.) and Sunday mornings.
