### **Al Service**

This Sunday we have an AI theme for the service with a discussion afterwards in the church. We will introduce the theme in the service and then explore the idea of artificial intelligence and worship and faith for a short time afterwards.

There has been an increasing number of stories and opinions about AI in the news over the last month. We will take some of those concerns as well as opportunities and wonder about them a little. We don't have any answers as AI is so new to most of us, though it is all around us: flying planes, interpreting X-rays, creating Spotify lists, or Netflix favourites based on our viewing habits. Google only lists those things we are interested in and when you open your iPhone with face recognition, all of that is AI.

We don't have any answers to that. It's not really a question anyway. Rather it is a shift in how we understand ourselves. We offer a space to explore that a little, following the service. It will, no doubt, be the first of several discussions about the development of artificial intelligence in the church and in our faith.
