Healing Service

New Kilpatrick has been holding monthly Sunday evening Healing Services for a couple of years now. What happens in a Healing Service?

In a Healing Service the atmosphere is calm and prayerful where we create a safe place for everyone. Prayers are made for healing, be it physical, mental, or spiritual. We offer space, silence, reflection as well as the traditional laying on of hands and occasionally anointing, and all of these are completely optional. Prayers are made for the needs of others not present and for the world.

There are various accounts of healing in the Bible: James 5:14-15 "Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord."

Sometimes God heals, sometimes God heals in a while, and sometimes, sometimes, we just need the space to reflect on what wholeness means, and how we live with longing and hope.
