Lodging House Mission

On Sundays 12th and 19th November, Jessie Cameron will be selling Christmas cards on behalf of The Lodging House Mission.

This is a Church of Scotland organisation that provides help and support to vulnerable adults, many of whom are homeless, in Glasgow. A free breakfast and lunch are provided seven days a week. Assistance is given in completing forms and housing applications, learning opportunities such as computer use are available as is welfare rights advice. There is a weekly health clinic providing advice on foot care, dental issues, and pharmaceutical requirements, whilst counselling is available from the Marie Trust. Service users also have access to showers, laundry facilities and haircuts. There is also a ladies' craft class and a community cinema. Every Friday, there is a spot in the programme for the Mission 'voice choir'.

There is a full-time chaplain available to provide ongoing spiritual advice. The LHM is heavily dependent on voluntary contributions from parishes throughout the West of Scotland and is part of a wider network of caring support from other churches.

It is hoped that the congregation will assist this worthwhile venture by purchasing Christmas cards in packs of ten for £4/£4.50. A table will be available in the Hall after the morning service.

St Gregory's Food Bank

St. Gregory's continues to provide food for the most vulnerable in society. As winter
approaches the need for our continued support
increases, so please carry on donating in the
same generous way that never fails to amaze us.

The foodbank is staffed entirely by a dedicated team of volunteers - which means that there are no staffing costs, and therefore every penny and every item of food donated passes directly to those in need. As ever all the usual essentials are very acceptable with emphasis on nutritional foods such as tinned meat, chicken, tuna, and beans - also pasta, rice, tea, coffee, and biscuits. Baby essentials are required also.

Clean jam jars with lids would be useful for splitting bulk foods into portions.

Monetary donations are also extremely welcome.

The halls are open Mon. - Fri. (9am - 2.30pm) and Sunday mornings.
