Foodbank Donations

Exciting news! One of our two charities, St. Gregory's, has been announced Scottish winner this year of the National Church Awards in the "Volunteering" category. The Award Ceremony took place at Mercers' Hall in the City of London on the 24th of October. This is a tremendous achievement and honour for St. Gregory's.

A total of 217 bags was given out to "service users" last week. At about £9 per basic bag (with additional items added where the bag is to cover 2 persons or more) the organisation has become a huge undertaking. St. Gregory's is expecting to dispense over 8,000 bags during the current year.

Both St. Gregory's and Birth, Baby and Beyond are extremely grateful for the continuing support from our congregation. As winter approaches, the need for donations will become even more vital.

Suggested items are listed as follows (no perishable food please):

Sugar, soup, tuna, jams, marmalade, pasta, spaghetti, biscuits, rice pudding, longlife milk, fruit. Also, Pet Foods.

Baby essentials - formula, food pouches, nappies, cream.

Letter from the Minister

Dear All -

I thought I should write to keep you up to date with some of the things happening in the life of the congregation as well as the Presbytery Plan. The good news is how much is being offered in the congregation.

Loop System in Hall

We've now corrected issues with the sound system in the hall The loop is working now, and people seem to be able to hear a lot better. If you use the system, please let us know if it is working better for yourselves

We are still exploring the church sound system; it works best round the edges, closer to the loop wire, but we are going to map the space and find out where sound quality is best.

Open Church

We are exploring ways to have the **church sanctuary** open most days, especially in the morning for people to come and have a quiet seat, as well as offering some short worship early in the morning on Mondays and Fridays.

In addition to that, from 14th November you'll begin seeing times when we will offer a **warm space** in the church hall, but we are attempting to fill that time with activities: making things for Christmas, knitting corners, reading spaces, serving coffee and tea, and creating community - even a keep fit class or art activities. If you are willing to help organise (not lead), then please let us know.

New and Old Activities

Church is certainly busier now, and all our groups are open to everyone, including the Guild, which is open to men and women. It is one of the ways we have evolved after Covid by finding common space for everyone in all we do. We have an open wellbeing group for the whole community, which was very popular on our first meeting in Massimo's. Perhaps that was the pizza! We're on again, 21st November in the new, bigger space in Massimo's with a question-and-answer session.

We also have a new Youth Group called Something Different and you'll see some photos in the bulletin of our fire pit and s'mores night.

And we have a much stronger relationships with two local food banks, St Gregory's and Birth, Baby and Beyond. Thank you for your generosity. It is hugely appreciated and genuinely makes a difference to a lot of people.

We're updating our web pages so we can include more of our heritage and include information about access. We are also adding more photos of what life is like here. The Podcast and YouTube video continue to be offered each week with about 70 folk logging on each time from various places round the country and the world.

Presbytery Plan

There continues to be much discussion about the Presbytery Plan. I've been a little reluctant to outline each version as it comes along, as people may think any one of them is set in stone, and none of them are.

However, what is going to be presented to Presbytery this month is a plan to have, sometime in the future, three ministers in Bearsden working together. But this is not immediate and indeed the suggestion is that the time it will take to get there lies outwith the lifetime of the plan, which is five years. The plan offers intermediate steps on that journey where New Kilpatrick would move in the direction of union with the Cross. Westerton and Killermont would become a union, and Baljaffray and St Luke's in Milngavie would form a union. But, and this is important, this is NOT set in stone. While the general shape may make sense, there is much still to discuss in the details and the Session are meeting next week to make presentations to the presbytery, as we have been doing throughout the process. You are welcome to attend that meeting if you wish.

This general plan will be presented to Presbytery on 22nd November. There will be more discussion, as it is across all 66 congregations of Clyde Presbytery. That number must reduce to 40 ministers!

However, we recognise where we are as a church now is not where we were a couple of generations ago, and ours is to respond to our current situation, with enough hope and flexibility in what we do, to allow for the church to evolve once more into what it is still yet to be. And for that to be better.

Futures

We are all very aware there is a lot of change and uncertainty, not just in the church but across everything we once took as certain. Ours is to respond knowing the greater certainty of love, shaped in our worship and stories of a God whose love holds it all. While everything else about the church might change, that is our faith and our anchor.

Thank you for allowing that future to be imagined and for being willing to journey towards it.

The sites were marvellous from running round so close to the Cutty Sark, running up to London Bridge in sunshine and seeing the arches within arches, being so close to Westminster and looking up at Big Ben and at the final turn, Buckingham Palace seemingly dwarfed by the Victoria Monument. The run up the Mall is actually quite short and before I knew I was finished in 6 hours and 20 minutes – not my fastest or my slowest time, but I did enjoy every cheer filled second.

I had my own supporters who popped up at unexpected places and what a boost - huge thanks to Neil, Iain, Julie, and Catriona who tell me that they had a fantastic day.

I met some fabulous people on the train to Blackheath, during the run, at the post run reception organised by Christian Aid and a great response from the staff on the underground and railways who the day before were striking for better conditions and pay.

Afterwards? Surprisingly OK with little to no stiffness and I can only put that down to the excellent coaching from my running club and the gym training, pilates and body balance at the Allander.

I loved it and I am so grateful to the support and prayers from the Cross and New Kilpatrick Churches and for the generous donations made to Christian Aid.

The finishers T-shirt this year says; We Start, Train, Sweat, Dream, Win, Run, Finish Together.

We certainly started together when I spoke at Bearsden Cross Church on 18th September, we ran together in spirit on 2nd October and finished this journey together on 16th October when I spoke at New Kilpatrick.
