

Traffic Matters: Following the

consultation on speed limits in Bearsden, a report was made to the full Council meeting in June, following which the Council has now made an Order which introduces a 20-mph speed limit across the whole of Bearsden effective on and from 8 September.

We understand that a report on the consultation on parking charges in the Glebe and on the adjacent streets will possibly not be ready until October.

As the Council is scheduled to meet on 2 October and the meeting after that is in December, it looks as if the timetable for introducing charges is slipping, and it could be 2026 before the necessary Order can be made, but we make no promises!
