Presbytery Plan There is not much to update yet on the Presbytery Plan.

What we know is that what was submitted is undergoing some amendments. The official word is that "The plan is progressing through its various stages of approval in a rather stately fashion."

The latest news is that it is hoped the plan will be approved this week after further discussion around building designations. It will then be presented to the June meeting of Presbytery in this updated form. We haven't heard anything at all, so we are presuming there is no change to the plan in this area.

If it is agreed at the June meeting, then it will take effect from then. By way of reminder, we are in a three-way grouping with The Cross and Cairns churches but have the length of the plan (5 years) to discuss how that will eventually be shaped.

General Assembly

The General Assembly meets from Saturday this week and I am a commissioner.

The reports and proposed deliverances are all online on the Church of Scotland website and can be downloaded. The Assembly Trustees Report makes rather dramatic reading. There are simply not enough ministers, and, with the new way of paying to central funds, it means that 85% of charges cannot fully pay for their ministry, even with the reduction of ministers (a total 450 with 150 mission development staff, but even that is going to be overestimated and there are 1200 charges at the moment). It means that the two funds that pay for ministry will run dry by 2027! Yet, on the other hand, the report about presbytery planning feels rather upbeat, though it doesn't feel like that on the ground.

It feels like the church is trying to keep doing all it has done and be the church it always has been in the same way it has over the last few generations but is not willing to make more meaningful decisions about what we need to be in the very near future.

The draw on reserves this year will be £13.4 million and that cannot last any length of time. The church structure is being reorganised again, moving away from the model decided just a few years ago into a broader body called the Faith Action Programme Leadership Team (I'll never remember that), with four different areas of work to focus on: Mission Support, People and Training, Public Life and Social Justice, Resource and Presence. In addition, there will be a fundamental assessment of what is essential work over the next few years and what can be stopped.

Looking for good news in it all is really recognising the moment when we have to become something else, but that is reading between the lines. We haven't yet been able to shift from the cultural view of who we are, and the Theological Forum's report on what it means to be church doesn't take us very far along that line either, still hanging on to how we have always understood ourselves and very little creative thinking.

It will be a stressful week for the church but yet, and genuinely, maybe one for rebirth, where we might find folk of vision to lead us, ideas being shaped and a sense that what we are about to face might actually lease the ideas and vision we need. I'll let you know how it all goes in the next bulletin, though you can keep abreast of it all on the Church of Scotland website livestream.
