Glasgow Presbytery Knitting Challenge

Glasgow Close Knit is an initiative launched by the Presbytery of Glasgow and homeless charity, the Lodging House Mission, as part of the anniversary celebrations marking 850 years since Glasgow became a Bishop's Burgh. Churchgoers and friends are enthusiastically knitting and crocheting eight-inch squares to create single-bed-sized blankets, which will be displayed in several locations in the city before being distributed to those in our community in need of comfort and warmth.

The target is 850 blankets!

At New Kilpatrick, we are using **DK yarn in** shades of blue and green for our squares, and we are already well on the way to our first blanket. We would love you to join this exciting project if you can. There is a box in the walkround for collecting squares, and you are welcome to take some wool from there. Any pattern at all is wonderful. Hopefully, we'll be able to start sewing up at the beginning of June.
