Mile of Loose Change

We are moving along quite nicely. We're out the hall doors and turned to the right to go up towards Gartconnell. Slowly but surely...

This project is intended to take up to two years and is in response to the deficit we will have this year of about £35,000. Our demographics as a congregation are changing and the cost of everything is rising significantly and we have never found ourselves in this position before.

We thought hard about how best to respond to this as we do not want to stop all the other partnership working and support we share with Glasgow City Mission, G15, St Gregory's Foodbank, Christian Aid and many, many others, who are always the priority in the Kingdom of God, and discovered that by creating a mile of £1 coins over the next two years would raise about £60,000, in effect all from our 'loose change'!

We felt this was low key, possible, a bit of fun and would enable us to continue the very generous support we are privileged to give our neighbours as we believe we are called here to do yet also keep everything going at 'home' without a big fundraising campaign - all from a few coins in our pocket.
