This project has been a tremendous success. Everyone has risen to the challenge and my only regret is that I have no accurate way of measuring just how many milk bottle tops we have sent off to Pathfinder.

I am about to send the sixth box. A photo of which is shown here.

The boxes are gifted from M&S in Bearsden. Quite large, as you can see.

So what is made from the MILK BOTTLE TOPS?

Well one useful thing is Fence Posts. The 'TOPS' are shredded and then using an extruding process, made into fences. No painting, no rotting. And Pathfinder blind clients get involved in this process.

So PLEASE keep bringing your Milk Bottle Tops to Church and putting them in the container provided.
