Our **donations** for coffee after the Midweek Services, Sunday Services and Coffee Pot for the months of October to December amounted to £1,625.52 and have again been donated to St Gregory's Food Bank. This brings the total for 2023 to £6,276.30 which is a fantastic total.

Members have also donated via the Church bank account a total of £4,063.75 which has also been transferred along with numerous envelopes with donations of cash handed in over the year.

Along with all the food donations handed in from week to week and at our specific collections at Harvest and the Gift Service, this been a tremendous help to St. Gregory's and the community they support.

Belonging is fundamental to who we are, and we always make an invitation to anyone who would like to formally join the church through profession of faith.



FREE Climate Emergency Training for people across East Dunbartonshire in February & March

People who live, work, or play in East Dunbartonshire are invited to attend free training to learn what the Climate Emergency means for local communities, and find out how they can take positive action.

Register your interest in attending the training by emailing <u>climate@keepscotlandbeautiful.org</u> outlining your name, which training date, and location you would like to attend.

The training is designed for people who are involved with, (or interested in), community organisations or communities. Participants who complete the training will have the opportunity to be certified as Carbon Literate, after gaining knowledge of the carbon costs and impacts of activities and identifying practical actions to tackle them. There is also an Introductory Session available for people wanting to find out more in just 60 minutes.
