### An Update on St. Gregory's Foodbank:

Since January, St. Gregory's has helped 11,750 adults and children in handing out 5,200 basic bags. There are 300 new people who have started using the Foodbank services so far this year. St. Gregory's have the help of 60 volunteers - 25 of whom work to keep the Foodbank open, stocked, and ready 5 days per week. Another 30 go shopping and take receipt of foods which need to be chilled or frozen, and others run the administration side of the work. The giving of their precious time, their dedication and great good will are so inspirational. Those who operate the Foodbank are extremely grateful to have the encouragement, prayers and great support of the New Kilpatrick congregation and it is vital that we continue to help those in our community who need our assistance.

Please keep filling our trug. Tins of meat, fish and vegetables are most welcome, along with the usual non-perishable foods and baby essentials. Monetary donations are also extremely welcome. The Halls are open Mon. to Fri. (9 a.m. to 2.30 p.m.) and Sunday mornings.
