The 8th of October will be an exciting and interesting Sunday as we invite two guests, Darren Philip and Suzi Farrant, to share worship with us, both of whom have done some pioneering work on intergenerational communities and what that means for churches.

Both have been working with the national church for many years, if not decades, and have a wealth of experience. We are going to tap into that, liberally, in considering some of the big existential questions of church, and how, perhaps, reimagining our model of a Sunday might help us face our future in a creative and positive way. Their ideas lead us towards a church community where the generations are more supportive of each other, worship together and learn from each other, which seems to be a way forward in a world that is less coherent.

We share the service based on their research, itself based on the thoughts of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Tea and coffee will be served in the church and then we will hold a discussion on what we have experienced and what this might mean for us in the future.
